

Affixing of posters, etc.

5. No person shall affix or cause or permit to be affixed to any wall, post, tree or any fixed object in a public place or adjacent to a public place any poster, sign or advertisement made of any material whatsoever without the written consent of a health officer.

Offences and penalties

6. Any person who, in contravention of these by-laws, commits an offence specified in the first column of the Schedule, shall be liable to pay the fine specified opposite thereto in the second column.

SCHEDULE (Section 6)

OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

<i>Offence</i>	<i>Penalty</i> \$
(a) street littering (bus tickets, food wrappers, cigarette-packets, etc.)	50,00
(b) littering at picnic spots, lay-bys, parks and open spaces	50,00
(c) discharging rubbish from a vehicle	100,00
(d) dumping of garden refuse or building rubble where prohibited	250,00
(e) dumping of dead animals, filth or any substance which is unwholesome, offensive or untidy	300,00
(f) dumping of hazardous waste material	1 000,00
(g) any contravention of section 5	300,00
(h) in respect of each continuing contravention, for each day during which the contravention continues	100,00

Victoria Falls (Anti-litter) By-laws, 1999

IT is hereby notified that the Minister of Local Government and National Housing has, in terms of section 229 of the Urban Councils Act [Chapter 29:15], made the following by-laws:—

Title

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Victoria Falls (Anti-litter) By-laws, 1999.

Application

2. These by-laws shall apply to the Victoria Falls Town Council area.

Interpretation

3. In these by-laws—

“council” means the Victoria Falls Town Council;

“health officer” means an environmental health officer or environmental health technician registered as such in terms of the Medical, Dental and Allied Professions Act [Chapter 27:08];

“litter” means any containers, wrappings, cartons, cigarette-packets, paper, vegetable matter, garden waste, hedge-clippings, dead animals, ash, tins, rubbish, bricks, stones, rubble, soil and any other matter or substance which is unwholesome, offensive or untidy;

“public place” includes any bridge, enclosure, foot-path, garden, park, garage, car-park, open space, pavement, road, service-lane, side-walk or any other area vested in or controlled by the council, to which the public or any section of the public has access.

Prohibition of the deposit of litter

4. No person shall deposit or abandon, or cause to be deposited or abandoned, any litter in a public place, except in a receptacle especially provided for the receipt of such litter.
